# FASTON\* Flag Receptacle With "C" Crimp

### SCOPE

#### 1.1. Content

This specification covers the performance, tests and quality requirements for the .187 FASTON\* flag receptacle with new style "C" crimp.

#### 1.2. Qualification

When tests are performed on the subject product line, procedures specified in Figure 1 shall be used. All inspections shall be performed using the applicable inspection plan and product drawing.

# 1.3. Qualification Test Results

Successful qualification testing on the subject product line was completed on 07Aug98. The Qualification Test Report number for this testing is 501-487. This documentation is on file at and available from Engineering Practices and Standards (EPS).

## 2. APPLICABLE DOCUMENTS

The following AMP documents form a part of this specification to the extent specified herein. Unless otherwise specified, the latest edition of the document applies. In the event of conflict between the requirements of this specification and the product drawing, the product drawing shall take precedence. # 3. REQUIREMENTS

# 3.1. Design and Construction

Product shall be of the design, construction and physical dimensions specified on the applicable product drawing.

### 3.2. Materials

Receptacle: Brass

### 3.3. Ratings

A. Voltage: 240 volts AC

B. Current: See Figure 4 for applicable current carrying capability

C. Temperature: -40 to 105°C



# 3.4. Performance and Test Description

Product is designed to meet the electrical, mechanical and environmental performance requirements specified in Figure 1. Unless otherwise specified, all tests shall be performed at ambient environmental conditions per AMP Specification 109-1.

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## 4. QUALITY ASSURANCE PROVISIONS

# 4.1. Qualification Testing

# A. Sample Selection

Samples shall be prepared in accordance with applicable Instruction Sheets and shall be selected at random from current production. Test groups 1 and 3 shall each consist of 30 receptacles crimped to 20 AWG wire, 30 receptacles crimped to 18 AWG wire, and 30 receptacles crimped to 16 AWG wire. Test group 2 shall consist of 30 receptacles crimped to 16 AWG wire.

# B. Test Sequence

Qualification inspection shall be verified by testing samples as specified in Figure 2.

## 4.2. Requalification Testing

If changes significantly affecting form, fit or function are made to the product or manufacturing process, product assurance shall coordinate requalification testing, consisting of all or part of the original testing sequence as determined by development/product, quality and reliability engineering.

# 4.3. Acceptance

Acceptance is based on verification that the product meets the requirements of Figure 1. Failures attributed to equipment, test setup or operator deficiencies shall not disqualify the product. When product failure occurs, corrective action shall be taken and samples resubmitted for qualification. Testing to confirm corrective action is required before resubmittal.

# 4.4. Quality Conformance Inspection

The applicable AMP quality inspection plan shall specify the sampling acceptable quality level to be used. Dimensional and functional requirements shall be in accordance with the applicable product drawing and this specification.



Termination Resistance Measurement Points

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

NOTE

To determine acceptable current carrying capacity for percentage connector loading and wire gage indicated, use the Multiplication Factor (F) from the above chart and multiply it times the Base rated Current for a single circuit at the maximum ambient operating temperature shown in Figure 4A.
