California Proposition 65

Proposition 65 (or Prop 65), officially known as the [Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986](#), was enacted as a ballot initiative in California (USA) in November 1986. Proposition 65 is intended to enable Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to chemicals in products they purchase, in their homes or workplaces and in the environment largely by requiring businesses to provide warnings about significant exposures to designated chemicals.

Proposition 65 requires the state of California to maintain [a list of chemicals recognized by the State of California as possibly causing cancer or reproductive toxicity](#). This list, which is updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.
